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### Duncan Fire - Access Entiat – Timeline:

Nov. 2014 **OSO – Again;** Pope Creek area mountain will fall into the Entiat Valley.

Dec. 17, 2014 **"Duncan fire revealed a piece of land** with extreme potential to slide off the side of the mountain; similar to OSO which happened earlier this year." E-mail to me from ERD.

Dec. 20, 2014 Request access after Labor Day for if the mountain has not fallen.

Dec. & Jan. Forestry professor & USGS volcanologist clients examine data on Pope Creek and report that a major land failure is extremely unlikely.

Jan. through June Icicle Outfitters clients, BCHW, WOGA, ATV, Snomobile and 4x4 Associations contact forest managers at all levels. WTA requests a tour of the burn.

**JUNE 1<sup>ST</sup> OPEN HOUSE** Petition becomes available for signatures.

Stakeholder's contacts shifts from the Entiat Ranger District to the Supervisor's and Regional Forester's offices.

June 9<sup>th</sup> First meeting of the group; name adopted Access Entiat. Met weekly for all of June & early July.

**FIRES:** Sleepy Hollow fire followed by the Chelan and Okanogan area fires changed public's focus away from the Duncan fire closure.

Around Aug. 10<sup>th</sup> the Wolverine fire got over Wilson Pass and proceeded to burn the Entiat Valley from the Entiat glacier moraine to mile post 31 (7 miles east of Cottonwood). Duncan Fire management is now interwoven with the Wolverine.
