Consent Agenda: Approve the January 19, 2024 Regular District Meeting Minutes, approve January Treasurer's Report and authorize paying bills.

M/S/C Dillon Miller moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Kurt Hosman Seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

PARTNER REPORTS: Hinterland Farms – Conservation Easement – Toby McKay, Paul D'Agnolo, and Michael Scisco

Paul D'Agnolo provided a slide presentation describing the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP) and how it applies to the protection of agricultural (ag) lands by way of conservation easements. Paul's role with the Commission serves as a contact for the Agricultural Conservation Easement Sponsorship (ACES) program. This is a voluntary agreement between landowners and an entity seeking to preserve the property's conservation values, such as protecting ag land from non-ag land developments. He talked about the agencies involved with this program, the costs, the challenges, and the time commitment it takes to get from point A to point B. Agencies involved are the Conservation Commission, the Recreation Conservation Office, the conservation district and the landowner. At the end of the process, the Commission is the easement holder and the landowner is paid for a conservation easement that preserves farmland, and reduces development potential.

Hinterland Farms is seeking a Conservation Easement. Lake Chelan is directly south of the Hinterland property. The goal is to protect the working farmlands, habitat and wildlife benefits. The District was asked to do an assessment of potential natural resource enhancements for the property. Other discussions followed regarding appraisals and landowner choices.

Ryan asked the Board members if they felt such a program was something they would like to pursue. Since the application window is only open every two years, Ryan already submitted an application. The Board agreed that it is a good program to pursue.

Ryan and the Board discussed the contracts list.

M/S/C Dillon Miller moved to approve the grants and contracts list. Kurt Hosman seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Review and Consider Updates to Cascadia Conservation District Operations Manual:

Ryan discussed the Operations Manual policies regarding potential part-time salaried positions, such as our archaeologist. Currently Kim's position is on-call. The workload is dependent on the weather, making it difficult to work enough hours every month, especially during winter, to receive benefits as an hourly, on-call employee. Ryan is seeking to make it a salaried part-time position. Additional changes discussed included use-or-lose vacation at the end of the year, and the expectation that exchange time is to be used

before vacation time. He proposed changing the policy wording for these items, pages 43 - 69, to include a work agreement form about exchange time, update the vacation and exchange time carryover policy to allow an additional three months to use exchange time balances and vacation amounts that exceed the annual cap, and changing Kim's part time archaeologist position to salaried with exchange time.

M/S/C Kurt Hosman moved to approve the updates to the Cascadia Conservation District Operations Manual. Dillon Miller seconded. Motion Passed unanimously.

Executive Director's report:

Ryan emailed his report to the Board yesterday. Word was received that another DOE grant has been awarded. This one does not require matching funds. He also applied for funding for a community engagement and diversity inclusion plan with bilingual help. The Commission approved \$20,000 for this purpose. He reminded everyone about the upcoming March 13 Supervisor Election and Open House.

At 3:15 p.m., the Board entered Executive Session for fifteen minutes to discuss an employee performance evaluation.

The Board resumed Regular Session at 3:30 p.m. No decisions were made.
