What is Riparian Habitat?

Riparian areas are the transition zones between land and water environments. These transition zones are very important to wildlife and human communities as they protect the adjacent waterbody and perform many important functions.

They Stabilize Shorelines - Trees and shrubs help hold the soil along streams and lakes, preventing banks from collapsing and eroding during periods of high water.

They Reduce Downstream Flooding -Trees and shrubs absorb runoff, letting water soak into the soil, recharging the groundwater which can help to prolong streamflow throughout the year.

They Improve Water Quality - plants filter out sediment, excess nutrients, pesticides, pathogens, and other pollutants before they enter the water.

Enhance wildlife habitat - Trees and shrubs provide habitat and food for fish, birds, and many other wildlife.
